Let Go of the Past

What is it that dominates your attention? What is it that you are most aware of day after day? One very common tendency and temptation most people struggle with is to become fixated upon sufferings, humiliations, mistakes and the false opinions of others. When we experience one or more of these burdens, we can be tempted to make them the central focus of our life.

For example, if you are unjustly humiliated and others have an negative opinion of you, it can be exceptionally hard to keep this from dominating your thoughts. Similarly, whatever it is that causes you grief or suffering can easily become the focal point of your life.

These tendencies must be overcome by a commitment to look beyond these obstacles and to gaze only on the Truth. What is the Truth? It's that which is in the Mind of God. Look at it from God's point of view. Will it matter tomorrow, a day or week and so on from now?

St. Paul's conversion was greeted with skepticism and fear. When he began preaching that Jesus is the Son of God, people said, "Isn't he the one who destroyed those who spoke of Jesus and has he come to do the same?" Paul even tried to join the disciples and they were even afraid of him. However, Paul never ignored his past, but spoke of the mercy of God.

Like Paul, we don't need to parade our failures or to pretend bad things or bad decisions didn't happen to you. Instead, we can thank the Lord that through His grace, our past is forgiven, our present is changed, and our



future is bright with hope for all He has prepared for us.






