

Next weekend we will have a Mission Priest from the Diocese of Same.

The Catholic Diocese of Same (pronounced SAW-may) is in Northeastern Tanzania, in the Kilimanjaro Region. Tanzania is one of the poorest countries in the world, with 80% of the population residing in the rural areas where a subsistence economy is practiced. Tanzania has a population of 57 million people, 15 million of whom live in absolute poverty, earning less than \$1.00 a day. One of the serious problems facing the people of Same Diocese is a shortage of clean water, which forces people to drink dirty water from unsafe sources. Traditionally, women and children spend an average of three hours a day collecting water. As a result, the health of the majority of the rural population is at risk. Over 3,000 children under five die each year and 65% of adults suffer from preventable diseases such as cholera, typhoid, and diarrhea.

During the Diocesan strategic plan, shortage of clean water and poor health were identified as the major problems of the rural population, and the decision was made that the Diocese should drill a well in each village of more than two thousand people. Nearby access to clean water gives women and children more time to grow food, earn an income, and go to school. Please give generously to this worthy cause.


