

Christmas Eve, for me as a child, was one of the longest days ever! As an adult, I find this day to be one filled with anticipation and excitement, for spiritually I know that tomorrow we celebrate the birth of Jesus my Lord.

But today the birth is not my focus, rather, my focus turns to His mother, Mary. Mary, an unwed girl, from a small town in a desert is asked the impossible; to trust so deeply in God when asked to bear God's son.
